Message from the President and Executive Director

Nearly 10 years ago NSCR embarked on a process to update our Mission and Vision. Our biggest challenge? Finding the right words to express common goals among NSCR's 30+ programs and services offered to a diverse array of people and organizations on the North Shore. Engaging our staff, Board and volunteers, we created a new Vision – A thriving North Shore community – and new Mission – To design and deliver programs and services that enhance well-being, social connections, empowerment and community participation.

With NSCR's 47 years of experience, we know that the core of our mission is to create real opportunities for strong social connections and bonds between people that allow for trust and reciprocity to grow. We know that when we assist our clients to gain knowledge and understanding, we empower them to live the lives they want. And we know that participation in community – individuals giving their time and experience to help others – builds strong, healthy, resilient communities.

With well-being at the centre of NSCR's work, we welcome the City of North Vancouver's recent draft Community Wellbeing Strategy. The Strategy will set the City's work and funding priorities over the next 10 years. As we write this message, we are providing feedback to their social planners and Councillors.

There is much to commend in the draft Strategy. The City aspires to be a place "where everyone belongs and has opportunities to thrive" with connection, equity and investment as levers to well-being. The plan has six areas of focus, each with a set of objectives: complete communities, housing for all, a city for all ages, inclusion/diversity/equity/accessibility, poverty reduction and partnerships/advocacy/financial supports for local partners like NSCR to help deliver community services and programs. There is great alignment between NSCR's Mission/Vision and CNV's draft strategy with our programs focused on children/families, housing, seniors, and more.

In this Annual Report, you will find descriptions and highlights of NSCR's many programs and services that enhance the well-being of our clients and community members. For example, our Man in the Moon program (page 7) brings together new fathers with their infant children to play and sing songs together. By facilitating a space for dads to meet, we hope they will build social connections with each other that will provide a rich network of support for them as parents and their families while empowering them to learn activities to enjoy with their children.

Our Community Connectors, as part of our Seniors One Stop program (pages 8-9), provide direct assistance to seniors on matters such as health, housing, and income. By providing support to address their needs, NSCR reduces seniors' social isolation and enhances their well-being. Our North Shore Young Civic Forum (page 15) provides a platform for younger adults to build their social connections to



each other, municipal councillors and staff and empowers them to better influence local government decision making that reflects younger perspectives.

We look forward to continue working with the City and our many other community partners to enhance well-being on the North Shore!

Supporting the Well-Being of Kids and Families




As a leader in child care and early childhood development, our programs and services enhance child care and the quality of family life by providing support and education to the early childhood community.

Our North Shore Child Care Resource and Referral Program (CCRR) funded

by the B.C. Provincial Government, provides assistance and training to child care providers and early childhood educators, while at the same time assisting families to find quality affordable child care. Workshops, newsletters, drop-in programs and other services allow children, families, and early childhood educators to connect and learn.

Our North Shore Community Action Program for Children (CAPC), funded by the Canadian Federal Government, supports the healthy development of young children and families facing challenging life circumstances.

Enhancing the Well-Being of Seniors and Caregivers

Seniors who maintain strong social connections continue to thrive as they age. NSCR offers a variety of programs that provide opportunities to maintain and increase their social connections, participate in the community and empower them to live their lives to the fullest.

North Shore Caregiver Support aims to support individuals caring for others, often seniors themselves, so the caregiver can maintain their own resilience, health and well-being. We offer a general Caregiver Support Group and specialized support groups such as Men caring for their Partners, Persian and Korean Wellness and Education Groups and a Bereavement Group.

North Shore Better at Home, funded by the United Way, supports seniors by providing them with seven basic non-medical services aimed at helping them maintain their independence. The result is better health outcomes, more independence and well-being for older adults. Our satellite program on Bowen Island offers services adapted for the unique needs of the island community.

North Shore Seniors One Stop supports the independence, dignity and health of North Shore seniors by providing community navigation including one-to-one consultation. We publish an annual North Shore

Engaging and Empowering Our Community



NSCR is committed to helping build a healthy, diverse and inclusive community across the North Shore. To do so, we design and deliver programs and services that promote volunteerism, facilitate access to justice, and advocate for affordable housing. We pilot new

initiatives such as intergenerational learning, support citizens through Democracy Café and assist people in navigating the information highway with directories and publications online and in print. Our programs include:

- Volunteer North Shore to connect people to volunteer opportunities to serve their community
- North Shore Community Legal Services to enhance affordable access to justice and our legal system
- North Shore Community Housing Action Committee to advocate for more affordable and accessible housing on the North Shore



- Intergenerational North
 Shore to bring people of all ages to learn together
- Democracy Café to learn about, influence and improve participation in our democracy
- Information North Shore to help navigate available services and resources in the community including our low-income tax clinic, a proven anti-poverty initiative
- Connect and Prepare is a pilot project in the City of North Vancouver bringing people in apartments together to build resilience and prepare for emergencies

North Shore Community Legal Services provides legal information, assistance, legal education workshops, advice and representation to individuals and families facing a variety of legal problems including housing, employment, income assistance, debt, family separation and divorce, wills and other issues. Our staff's assistance to those with lower incomes promotes equity and access to justice for all.

Our **North Shore Community Housing Action Committee** (CHAC) is an independent, non-partisan group of volunteers and experts who educate, undertake research and advocate to increase affordable housing options.

Nurturing Intergenerational Learning

Research demonstrates that relationships and activities involving people of varied age groups is deeply enriching to the lives of all. Given NSCR's mandate to enhance well-being and with a large contingent of community partners, our **Intergenerational North Shore (InterGenNS) program** has embarked on an effort to increase the knowledge of the benefits of intergenerational activities while identifying and enhancing opportunities for North Shore residents to engage with older and younger generations.

InterGenNS has a steering committee and broad table of community partners. Three phases of research have been completed in partnership with Simon Fraser University, Gerontology Department and work is continuing to deepen and disseminate our understanding of intergenerational resources and activities.

Promoting Democratic Participation

North Shore Democracy Café is a non-partisan program that encourages residents and citizens to more actively participate in civic life while encouraging governments to be more responsive to citizens' desires and needs. We are planning for our fourth cohort of the North Shore Young Civic Forum to assit younger adults aged 19–39 to learn about and better influence local governments.


