Message from the President and Executive Director

Collaboration with our community partners on the North Shore is a cornerstone of the way we work at NSCR. With our mandate to enhance wellbeing of individuals and the community, we can better achieve more when we work together with our community partners to collectively increase the impact of our efforts.

Collaboration is a driving force of the agency's work and NSCR purposely included it as a Strategic Priority in our 2022-2026 Strategic Plan:

"Objective 1.2: NSCR collaborates with existing and new community partners to enhance current programs and services and identify new opportunities

Collaboration is fundamental to NSCR's operations: we have a proud history of working effectively with community partners to deliver programs and services that integrate all our strengths, to benefit those we serve together. We aim to continue and expand this commitment, both to deepen current activities and to identify and make the most of new service delivery opportunities."

This strategic priority is evidenced by many strong, collaborative partnerships NSCR enjoys with other agencies on the North Shore. For example, NSCR's Caregiver Support and Seniors One Stop programs both

work closely with Vancouver Coastal Health to organize workshops for our caregivers and expand social prescribing by doctors so that our Community Connectors can address social isolation of seniors. The Volunteer North Shore program works with Impact North Shore, libraries and others to present the NS Volunteer Fair. The Child and Family program partners with the West Vancouver School District to design and deliver professional development workshops to early childhood educators so they can continue to provide quality care for families and children on the North Shore. Our Community Housing Action Committee is a group of organizations and people that come together to advocate for more affordable housing on the North Shore. The Family Law Advocate collaborates with the North Shore Women's Centre to offer women on-site legal assistance. In addition to other agencies, NSCR works closely with governments, funders, and donors to advance our mission.

Competition for funding, resources, attention, and recognition weakens all North Shore organizations' abilities to make meaningful changes. There are no real 'winners or losers' - just a decline in the overall quality of life for the community that we love., Collaboration is a key to growth and to sustaining community wellbeing.



At NSCR, we believe our collaborative relationships result in better outcomes for individuals and the community on the North Shore.



Supporting the Wellbeing of Kids and Families



As a leader in child care and early childhood development, our programs and services enhance child care and the quality of family life by providing support and education to the early childhood community.

Our North Shore Child Care Resource and Referral Program (CCRR), funded

by the B.C. Provincial Government, provides assistance and training to child care providers and early childhood educators, while at the same time assisting families to find quality affordable child care. Workshops, newsletters, drop-in programs and other services allow children, families, and early childhood educators to connect and learn.

Our North Shore Community Action Program for Children (CAPC), funded by the Government of Canada, supports the healthy development of young children and families facing challenging life circumstances.

Enhancing the Wellbeing of Seniors and Caregivers

Seniors who maintain strong social connections continue to thrive as they age. NSCR offers a variety of programs that provide opportunities to maintain and increase their social connections, participate in the community and empower them to live their lives to the fullest.

North Shore Caregiver Support aims to support individuals caring for others, often seniors themselves, so the caregiver can maintain their own resilience, health and well-being. We offer a general Caregiver Support Group and specialized support groups such as Men caring for their Partners, Persian and Korean Wellness and Education Groups and a Bereavement Group. The program also helps caregivers and the bereaved find resources, and offers free single and multi-session workshops on various aspects of caregiving

North Shore Better at Home, funded by the United Way, supports seniors by providing them with seven basic non-medical services aimed at helping them maintain their independence. The result is better health outcomes, more independence, and well-being for older adults. Our satellite program on Bowen Island offers services adapted for the unique needs of the island community.

North Shore Seniors One Stop supports the independence, dignity and health of North Shore seniors by providing community navigation including one-to-one consultation. We publish an annual North Shore



North Shore Community Legal Services provides legal information, assistance, legal education workshops, advice and representation to individuals and families facing a variety of legal problems including housing, employment, income assistance, debt, family separation, divorce, wills and other issues. Advocating for Affordable Housing

Affordable, accessible housing is key to ensuring a diverse and inclusive community on the North Shore. Our North Shore Community Housing Action Committee (CHAC) is an independent, non-partisan group of volunteers and experts who educate, undertake research and advocate to increase affordable housing options.

Nurturing Intergenerational Learning

Intergenerational North Shore (InterGenNS) is a grassroots initiative that works to build and grow intergenerational programs, connections, and collaborations on the North Shore. InterGenNS is a project by and for the community and is informed by an engaged group of community partners and a steering committee. We provide a Program Directory and Resource Hub on the North Shore Community Resources website and host a quarterly Community of Practice for interested community organizations to brainstorm, connect, and share about their programs. InterGenNS also plans and engages in events that bring together youth and seniors to connect and learn from each other.

Promoting Democratic Participation

North Shore Democracy Café is a non-partisan program that encourages residents and citizens to more actively participate in civic life while encouraging governments to be more responsive to citizens' desires and needs. We are planning for our fifth cohort of the North Shore Young Civic Forum in 2025 to assist younger adults aged 19-39 to learn about and better influence local governments.

Jasmine, a parent with a 3-year-old and infant child, is a regular participant in NSCR's Mother Goose program. While chatting with Patricia, our Mother Goose facilitator. Jasmine shares that she is separating from her spouse and having difficulty with navigating the separation process. She also has limited family support.

The Mother Goose facilitator refers Jasmine to our Family Law Advocate, Chris, who meets with Jasmine and provides her with legal advice regarding child support, shared parenting time, and creating a separation agreement. As part of the Family Law Advocate's assistance, Jasmine receives help from NSCR's Income Tax Program as she hasn't filed her tax return for a couple of years, which is required in order to receive some of the financial aid.

With NSCR's support, Jasmine gains confidence in navigating a very difficult period for her and her family, gaining skills she can use going forward. She continues to participate in NSCR's Child and Parent programming as her children grow older.


